World War II Honor Flight

World War I I ended in 1945. There were 16 million American men and women in service. Four hundred thousand had been killed. The Memorial to the war was not approved until 48 years later, after years of government foot dragging. Senator Robert Dole of Kansas, a wounded combat veteran, is credited with finally pushing it through. Now Dole has a place at a bus stop where he greets visitors to the Memorial. The Memorial was completed none too soon. WW I I vets are dying at the rate of 1000 a day. Thanks to Dole and his friends, the Memorial was funded largely with private donations.

Most States have groups that sponsor honor flights to the Memorial for WW II veterans. Mankato veterans were sponsored by the Southeastern MN Honor Flight based in Rochester. Rochester veterans have erected a veterans memorial at Soldier's Field which is well worth seeing on your next visit to Rochester.

A chartered bus came to Mankato to pick up Mankato's vets for the trip to Washington. The bus brought wheel chairs and care takers for those vets who could not tour without help. We spent the night in Rochester and were bused to the airport where we were greeted by a large crowd who thanked us for our service and wished us well.

During the flight we had mail call. Honor flight volunteers had contacted our families and friends who were asked for letters thanking us for our service. The response was huge. Each of us received a hand lettered mail bag containing about 30 pieces of mail. It included mail from school children who thanked us and asked for replies telling them what it was like to be in the war. We received a sack lunch before arriving at Washington International at about 9 am, EDT. As we taxied to the Gate a fire truck on either side of the taxiway doused our plane with tall jets of water. In the terminal, we were again met by a large crowd who thanked us for our service. We were bused to the WW I I Memorial where we spent about two hours. It is constructed around a large pool. There are 3 story towers opposing each other on the North and South side containing large intertwined bronze castings of American Eagles. These are connected by towers for each State, and a Freedom Wall bearing 4000 sculpted gold stars, each representing 100 American dead, which brought tears to the eyes of many veterans.

The Viet Nam Wall, Lincoln Memorial, and Korean Memorial are all within walking distance. After them, we went to the Women's Memorial at Arlington for lunch. Everyone had walked enough, so we bus toured the US Capital, the native american building constructed of Vetter Stone from Mankato, the national archives and the US Navy Monument.

Back to the airport where we were again greeted by a large crowd who thanked us for our service. When we reached Rochester at about 9:30pm, we were again greeted by a large crowd, met by family members, and returned to Mankato.

The efforts of the Honor Flight volunteers were incredible. I can't thank them enough. It was a trip I'll never forget.



many different items. The biggest being our 2011 Show Chairman and as this years Chorus Manager - Booking.




Entertainment was then provided by the Chorus & our own chapter 2011 BOTY - Ron Meyer quartets RFD, Soul Purpose, and Magic.


