REMEMBERING RIP KIRBY

I regret that I cant't be with all of you today to celebrate the life of my close friend Rip Kirby. My thoughts today are with Rip's family.

Rip was one of the most thoughtful and talented people I knew. Rip and I spent many hours together, both singing and playing music. I first met him while playing gigs while in college at MSU. At that time he was playing with the "Ernie Coopman" Old Time Band and I was playing with "Mary Tenhoff" Dance Band.

We also discovered that singing was fun! We formed a barbershop quartet, called it "The Jones Boys". Norm Erickson and Jim Manahan joined us. Jim didn't last long so Ron Steinberg joined us for a while until Bruce Gray came along. We needed outfits, so we went to Kato Engineering where we knew Cecil Jones. We asked him if he would sponsor us, he did, and that's where we got the name and he bought us our first outfits.

We wanted to compete in the LO'L District Contest so we had to join the Minnetonka Chapter to be eligible. At competition, we discovered that we couldn't use the name "Jones". So, on the spot, we changed the name to "Joan's" Boys. Tenor Norm Erickson's wife's first name was Joan.... We made the cut at competition, so we had to sing two more songs. The problem with that was, we didn't have two more songs to sing... Oh well!!

We then changed our name to "The Jefferson Lords". The reason being that we had learned a song by that name and thought it was a good one.

Soon after that, we thought that a chorus would be great for the Mankato area. Yes, the Mankato "Riverblenders" were chartered and still exist today.

Still changing, Warren Hettinga joined the quartet as the new lead. Yes, we changed our name again to "The Saturday Review". About the same time Norm decided to move to Prior Lake, so we needed a tenor. Eddie Wirtz from Waseca joined us.

We competed several times, sang several chapter shows around the area and met more wonderful people. It wasn't long before Warren and Eddie joined another quartet and we were joined by Steve hardy and Richard Treptow. Another name change - "The Ring Of Gold" was formed. After several competitions and many chapter shows we called it quits.

Rip was always the center of attention on stage, cracking jokes and singing a wonderful bass part. Everyone knew Rip. The "The Ring Of Gold" won the coveted Land O' Lakes District Championship medal and we went on to represent the Land O' Lakes District at International Competitions five times.

Rip and I lost touch for a while. During that period of time I was approached by the district to think about the judging. So I attended Category School and became a certified judge. Twenty years later, after scoring at least 2,000 quartets and 1,500 choruses, I hung up my badge.

At the end of my judging life, I knew of a Dixie Land Band that had started to play. Yes, the "Blue Ox Jazz Band" was brought back to life. You got it!! Rip was at the center of this rebirth. I listened and watched as they regrouped. They had great leadership with Lowell and Ted Schreyer, Hal Nelson, Jim Johnson, and Karl Kittelson. Every once in a while I got a chance to sit in. Rip was always a favorite to listen to as well as his impromptu comments.

Well, so much for my ramblings.. He was a good friend, a good musician, and I will miss him greatly.

I'm missing playing today with the "Blue Ox". Hey gang, how about playing one of Rip's favorites - like "In The Garden". Be sure it's his tempo!! Hope to see you all right here at the "Pub" on Christmas Eve Day. Don't fail to miss it!!


My thanks to Bailey and all the others who gave me their wisdom these past two years. I'm honored to have been your President.
